REPORT

Road Safety Abhiyan, 2022-23

(15th March 2023 – 17th March 2023)

"Road Safety Abhiyan" was celebrated in HLG Government College, Tauru (Nuh) to make students aware of traffic rules and safety precautions that should be taken while driving. Through the teachers' enactments, students learned about the rules and various sign boards on the road. The interactive sessions held during these enactments were also well attended by students. Overall, it was a very informative and fruitful Abhiyan for the students.

The increase in recent years in the number of traffic accidents, injuries, and fatalities gravely concerns the Indian government. It acknowledges that traffic accidents have grown to be a significant public health concern, with poor and vulnerable road users being the majority of the victims.

The Indian government also acknowledges the necessity for a comprehensive approach to road safety because accidents involving motor vehicles, roads, and people all include these three different types of infrastructure. It also acknowledges that the Central and State Governments share responsibilities for lowering the frequency of traffic accidents, injuries, and fatalities, regardless of jurisdiction.

In light of this, the Government of India declares its resolve to significantly reduce the mortality and morbidity brought on by traffic accidents in this National Road Safety Policy. The Government of India is dedicated to: Raising Awareness about Road Safety Problems in order to achieve a significant improvement in road safety.

The government will step up efforts to raise public understanding of the numerous components of road safety, the social and economic effects of traffic accidents, and what can be done to stop the growing threat of traffic accidents. This would make it possible and

empower the various stakeholders to contribute significantly to the cause of enhancing road safety.

The upcoming Global Status Report is set for release in 2023. It aims to monitor progress of the Decade of Action for Road Safety and the Sustainable Development Goals Target 3.6 of halving the number of deaths and injuries from road traffic crashes by 2030 (WHO, 2022).

The United Nations General Assembly declared within its Resolution 74/299 a Decade of Action for Road Safety 2021-2030 with a target to reduce the amount of road traffic death and injured persons by at least 50 % during that period and mandated WHO and the UN Regional Commissions in collaboration with the UN Road Safety Collaboration to prepare a plan of action. In October 2021, the Global Plan for the Decade of Action for Road Safety 2021-2030 was launched. The UNECE Plan of Action for Road Safety 2023 – 2030 will stem from elements and a principle contained in the Global Plan for the Decade of Action for Road Safety 2021- 2030 and strives to provide support to countries for the implementation of the Global Plan. It will contribute to achieving the global road safety target of a 50% reduction in road death and injuries by supporting implementation of the ITC Recommendations⁴ and the UN road safety legal instruments as a basis for an integrated safe system approach (UNECE, 2022).

The 2023 Global Status Report also aims to evaluate gaps in road safety at the national level to stimulate more action that saves lives, to generate more and better data to stimulate research, to assess the overall road safety situations in all United Nations Member States and to assess any changes since the publication of previous versions of the report.

The last Global Status Report, released in December 2018, revealed that around 1.3 million people die each year as a result of road traffic crashes, that 93% of the world's fatalities on the roads occur in low-and middle-income countries and that road traffic injury are the leading cause of death among children and young adults aged 5-29 years (WHO, 2022).

Road safety is an issue of prime concern to all. Be it a pedestrian, rickshaw puller or a vehicle driver, anyone can fall prey to mishaps on roads. The last Global Status Report, released in December 2018, revealed that around 1.3 million people die each year as a

result of road traffic crashes, that 93% of the world's fatalities on the roads occur in low- and middle-income countries and that road traffic injury are the leading cause of death among children and young adults aged 5-29 years (WHO, 2022).

Traffic Interpretation Centre of HLG GC, Tauru made an attempt to reduce the number of such unfortunate incidences by sensitizing students towards this global issue by celebrating 'Road Safety Abhiyan' from March 15 – March 17, 2023. The programme was initiated by Principal's address to the students discussing the role of parents in preventing minor driving. It was followed by a seminar cum workshop conducted by I.P.S Mr. Sujit Sankar from Bhiwadi Police on March 17, 2023 in the college Park. IPS Mr. Sujit Sankar interacted with the students raising the issues of rash – driving, drunk driving, and road rage with special mention to minor driving. He also discussed immediate causes and traumatic effects of impulsive behavior of people on roads. The importance of obeying traffic rules while travelling on the roads was also discussed. Students were sensitized on the issue so as to make them a responsible road user. The aim of the workshop was to enhance respect for one's life and that of others- and inculcate the sensitivity that each life matters, thereby inspiring students to act responsibly on the road and make Indian road the safest in the world.

Finally, IPS Sujit Sankar, Bhiwadi Police, asked the participants to pledge on their personal commitment towards road safety.

The personal commitments are:

I commit to:

- Always wear a helmet while riding a two-wheeler.
- Never drink and drive.
- Always wear a seat belt while driving a car.
- Never text or talk on the mobile phone while driving.
- Always obey traffic rules.
- Act as a Good Samaritan and help road accident victims.

Road safety Abhiyan is a national event aimed at raising public awareness about traffic rules and ultimately to reduce casualties due to road accidents. Millions lose their life and millions get injured in road accidents globally; mainly, due to lack of awareness about traffic rules or a behavior of flouting them. Therefore, to make people more aware of the traffic rules and to persuade those to follow rules while on road; the Road Safety Abhiyan is observed annually. To create more aware and responsible citizens, HLG GC, Tauru, also participated in this initiative and observed the Road Safety Abhiyan from March 15 to March 17, 2023. During the entire Abhiyan the campaign was celebrated through various activities and competitions integrated with different disciplines. Students made colorful posters and wrote slogans to raise awareness about rules and regulation to be observed while on roads. They also expressed their thoughts and opinions through essay writing and advising people to avoid drunken driving, over speeding and to wear helmets and seat belts and to avoid accidents. Students also participated in a road safety rally depicting the need to be more careful and compassionate while behind the wheel. It was a great opportunity for students who participated with zeal and enthusiasm and enjoyed being a part of such an initiative aimed at bringing a positive change in the society.

Poster Making Competition

Conclusion

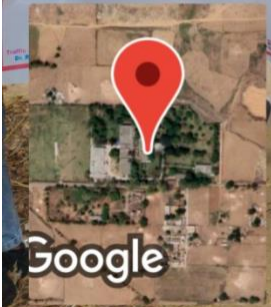
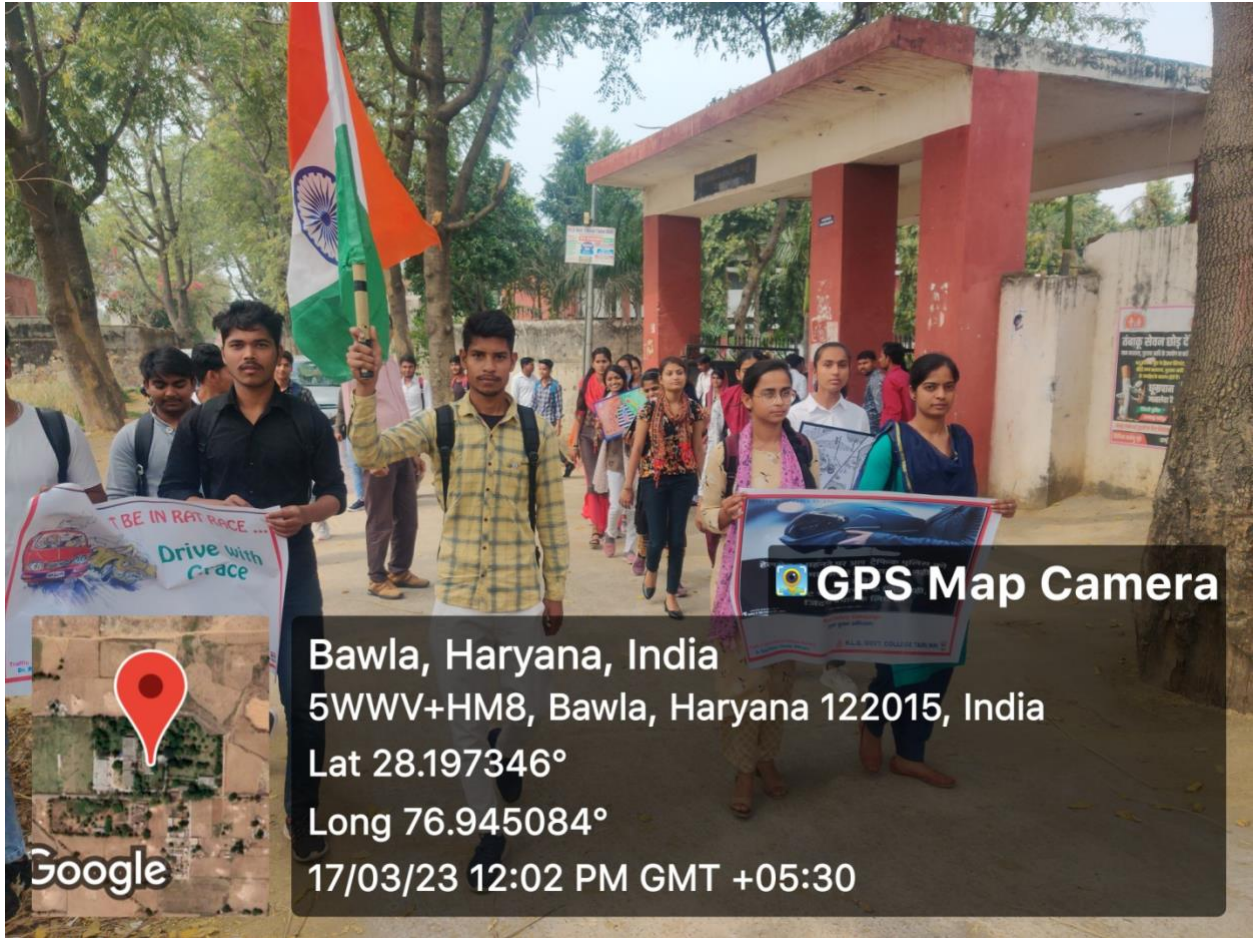

placards to make general public aware of these rules. The general public showed great interest in the rally and got the message required.

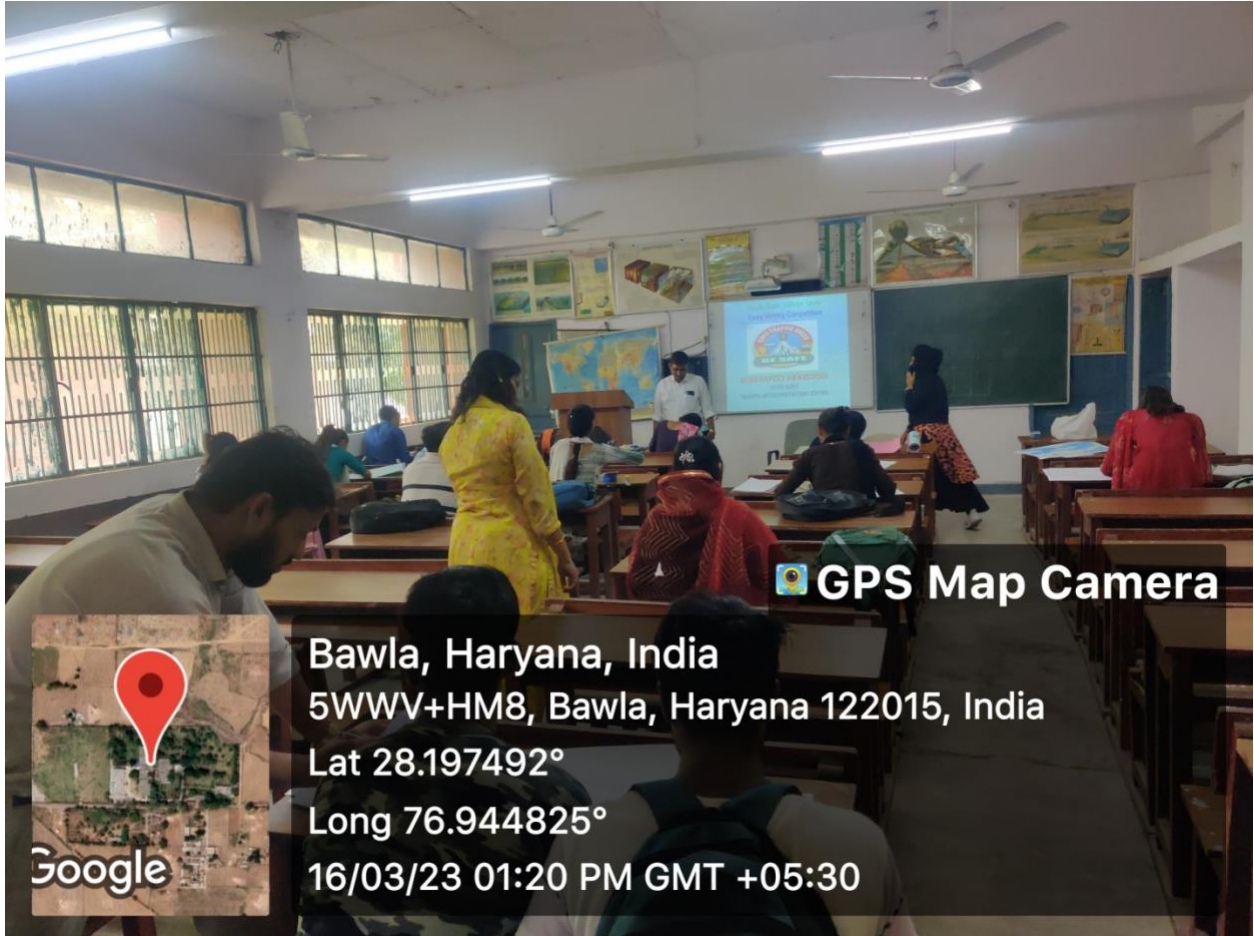
