#### 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

When it comes to the institutional preparedness for National education policy-2020, the college is eager to follow the NEP higher education guidelines in letter and spirit as and when it is implemented by the government of the state and the affiliating university. Though the college cannot exactly follow the STEM formula as it s not an engineering college, yet when the NEP is implemented it can take steps towards a more holistic and multidisciplinary education by integrating the humanities with other disciplines like Science, Maths and Commerce which are already being taught in the college. As a part of its multidisciplinary education model, the Arts students in the college are compulsorily taught subjects like Basics of Computer and Environment Science as a part of their syllabi. On the other hand, the students from Commerce and Science faculties are given opportunity to learn soft-skills, communication and pronunciation in the Language Lab of the college. The college has the locational advantage of being surrounded by cities like Gurugram, Dharuhera and Bhiwadi which can help its students immensely as the college hopes to set up start-up incubation centres in line with the spirit of the NEP-2020.

#### 16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is an innovative scheme envisioned in NEP-2020 which facilitates the students' freedom in choosing their subjects and courses. It also facilitates multiple entries and exit points in their academic programs. There will be an Academic Bank Account for every student and credits will be automatically awarded to students who pursue and clear an exam. The college will keep the records/details up-to-date and upload the credits in the account of the student on the digital portal. A unique ID and password will be

created using which the students can check the status of their credits any time. The credits can be redeemed and on their basis the student can seek admission in any other university in the 2nd year within seven years. HLG Govt. College Tauru shall abide by the curriculum and structure prepared by the affiliating university in this regard.

## 17.Skill development:

The college understands that the future belongs to those who learn more and more skills and then combine them in creative and productive ways. A big gap is there for everyone to see between the industrial/occupational demands and the kind of skills we equip our students with when they leave the college after the completion of their studies. The college wishes to play its role towards the achievement of the vision stated in NEP-2020 by equipping the students with employable skills at different stages of college education. Interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary teaching-learning and research approaches can be a way to achieve this target once NEP-2020 is implemented. The college is already running computer and soft-skills classes for skill enhancement among students. Under the New Education Policy, the college, with due permission and support from the Higher Education Department and affiliating university, will try to introduce new computer courses like Web designing, Cyber Security, Data Management etc. to equip the students with employable skills for the surrounding industrial areas and elsewhere.

## 18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

So far as the appropriate integration of Indian knowledge system in the teaching-learning process and curriculum is concerned, most of the teaching faculty makes use of Hindi, the official language of the Union, in the classroom teaching. Fortunately, Hindi happens to be the mother tongue of the overwhelming majority of the teaching staff as well as the students. Hindi, along with other Indian languages and vernaculars, is a window on the Indian culture and history. Indian culture and Indianness can be best explained and understood through the medium of Indian languages only. Besides this, the college promotes Haryanvi culture and dialect through various cultural activities like folk songs and folk dance and, thus, supports and preserves the cultural wealth of the state. Presently, the college follows the offline/physical classes model and there is no provision of regular online classes except when the online mode is necessitated by lock-down or SOPs. The college will

make the required changes and arrangements when the necessity for the same arises due to the implementation of NEP as the college has smart class rooms and 50 MPBS internet connection.

#### 19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Presently, the college has in place the traditional education system which focuses on what is taught. But with the implementation of NEP-2020, it will readily switch over to Outcome Based Education (OBE) model which puts more emphases on what the students learn during and the completion of a course instead of what is taught. OBE is an education system which focuses on the skill sets which a student acquires at the end of the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and the 4th year of a particular course. This, in turn, increases the employability of the student outside the boundaries of the institute. Though even in the traditional system, each discipline/subject has its stated program and course outcomes but the OBE ensures a much greater scope for clarity. Another advantage of OBE is that it enables the students to choose what they want to read, and when they wish to read it.

#### 20.Distance education/online education:

As stated earlier HLG Govt. College Tauru is an affiliating government institute. Distance education and online education are largely policy matters and the college is bound to follow the instructions/guidelines issued either by the state government or the affiliating university. Presently the college admits only the regular students and there is no provision for distance education. For online and digital education, which no doubt is the need of the hour, the teachers will require proper training and also a restructuring of the faculty into online and offline faculty keeping in view the skills of the different teachers. It will require some physical restructuring also because for effective distance and online teaching, the college will require greater digital infrastructure, separate rooms and labs for online and offline classes, online teaching platforms and tools, and digital repository. These again are largely the policy issues which lie beyond the purview of the college.

Our College is a government institution which is affiliated to Gurugram University , Gurugram and adheres to its guidelines in particular and Director General, Higher Education Haryana in general. Principal is the Head of the institution who convenes a meeting of teaching staff at the outset of the academic session to discuss mechanism for effective delivery of curriculum. Academic session of 2020-21 was almost completely in online mode requiring digital medium for curriculum delivery. Faculty membersalso attended FDPs and workshops on managing online classes to improve their ICT skills and working of learning management system. There are seven smart classrooms in our college to impart quality education to students to their entire satisfaction. During Covid 19 Pandemic lockdown period ,students were taught online. Classes were conducted using online medium like Google meet applications, Zoom application, Learning management system etc.WhatsApp groups were formed and video link , Power point presentation, and PDF files related to the prescribed syllabus were shared with the students. Contact numbers of teachers were also shared with the students for doubt clearing sessions and classes. Inter class E Quiz contest and essay writing competition of all students are held.Library facilities were made online where in students could access relevant books, journals

,magazines and any other e resources. Students of PG Geography conducted a Field Survey on topic entitled " Socio-Economic Status of Bhogipur Village in the Nuh District of Haryana ".

#### INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

#### 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

HLG Govt. College Tauru is a rural college situated in the Nuh district of Haryana. The total area of the college campus including the buildings, the ground and the lawns- is 12 acre, 6 kanal and 13 marla. The college has 15 classrooms which include 7 smart class rooms (two Geography labs are also being used as smart class rooms) and one Edusat room. The college 14 labs which include 8 science labs, 2 computer labs, 2 geography labs, one commerce lab and one language lab. The college has a library which no doubt needs to be augmented to meet the requirement of the increasing strength of students. Shortage of regular staff in the library also has been a persistent problem for many years now. So far as the availability of computers for students is concerned, the college has 93 computers. So, there is one computer for every ten students in the college. All labs and smart class rooms are Wi-Fi enabled. The strength of the college has increased substantially over the last two years, hence a need for more classrooms is being felt. The college has an auditorium which is used as a seminar hall also whenever the need arises.

Solid-Waste Management: The collecting, treating, and disposing of solid material that is discarded because it has served its purpose or is no longer useful. Improper disposal of solid waste can create unsanitary conditions, and these conditions in turn can lead to pollution of the environment and to outbreaks of disease. In the college all extracts of trees, leaves, plants are put in a dig to decompose and used as manure in future.

Other regular solid waste is collected in dust bins placed at strategic locations, brought together and taken away periodically by the waste collection agency of the municipal body. Other solid waste is collected at a place and sold to scrap vendors, adding to revenue. Wash rooms wastes are directed to a septic tank while effluents from laboratories are directed into separate underground tanks and prevented from escaping into the environment. Sanitary napkins are disposed of by an incinerator in the Girls' Common Room, and no other biomedical waste is generated. E-waste is sold periodically if not usable or reparable and depending on its quantity, to scrap dealers who deal especially in e-waste, for safe recycling.
